Together for 2s Funding

Some **2 year olds** may claim up to 15 hours per week of funded childcare, that is 570 hours per academic year

3 & 4 Year Old - Universal Funding

All **3-4 year olds** can claim up to 15 hours per week of funded childcare, that is 570 hours per academic year

Under 2 Year Old – Working Family Funding

Some children that are **Under 2** may access 1140 hours of funded childcare through working families funding per academic year

2 year old – Working Family Funding

Some children that are **2 years old** may access 1140 hours of funded childcare through working families funding per academic year.

3 & 4 Year Old - Working Family Funding

Some children **3&4 years old children** may be able to access the 570 hours in addition to their universal entitlement per academic year

Going to work after having a baby can be daunting. Under 2 year old working family funding can help with the cost of sending your baby to childcare. You may be able to access 30 hours of funded childcare per week.

Attending a childcare setting opens new opportunities for learning and development. Development areas include communication and language, personal, social and emotional development, physical development including coordination and self-care skills, literacy, mathematics, understanding the world and expressive arts and design.

Apply to see if you can access funded childcare hours from the term after your child turns 9 months old.

Together for 2s Funding



Some 2 year olds could be eligible* for up to 570 hours of funded childcare per academic year.



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Explore the Criteria for Together for 2s childcare funding. There are different ways to be eligible for 15 hours of funded childcare for your 2 year old.

- Economic grounds,
- No recourse to public funds (NRFP),
- Disability living allowance (DLA),
- Child looked after (CLA)
- Educational, health and care plan (EHCP) criteria.

Apply, to see if you can access funded childcare hours the term after your child's 2nd birthday.

of funded childcare per
academic year.**



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Great news!

You don't need to apply for the 15 hours universal funding as it is available to all children the term after they turn 3 years old. Your chosen nursery, pre-school, or childminder will handle the necessary arrangements for you.

Development areas include communication and language, Personal, social and emotional development, physical development including coordination and self-care skills, literacy, mathematics, understanding the world and expressive arts and design.

Child's 3rd birthday falls between:	You can claim from:
1st September to 31st December	1st January (Spring Term)
1st January to 31st March	1st April (Summer Term)
1st April to 31st August	1st September (Autumn Term)

Working parents of 3&4 year olds could be eligible* for an additional 570 hours of funded childcare per academic year.

Unlock early education with Early Years Bromley. If you are working, you may be able to access an additional 15 hours of funded childcare. If eligible for the additional entitlement, you can use with the Universal entitlement you to access up to 30 hours of the funded childcare per week.
